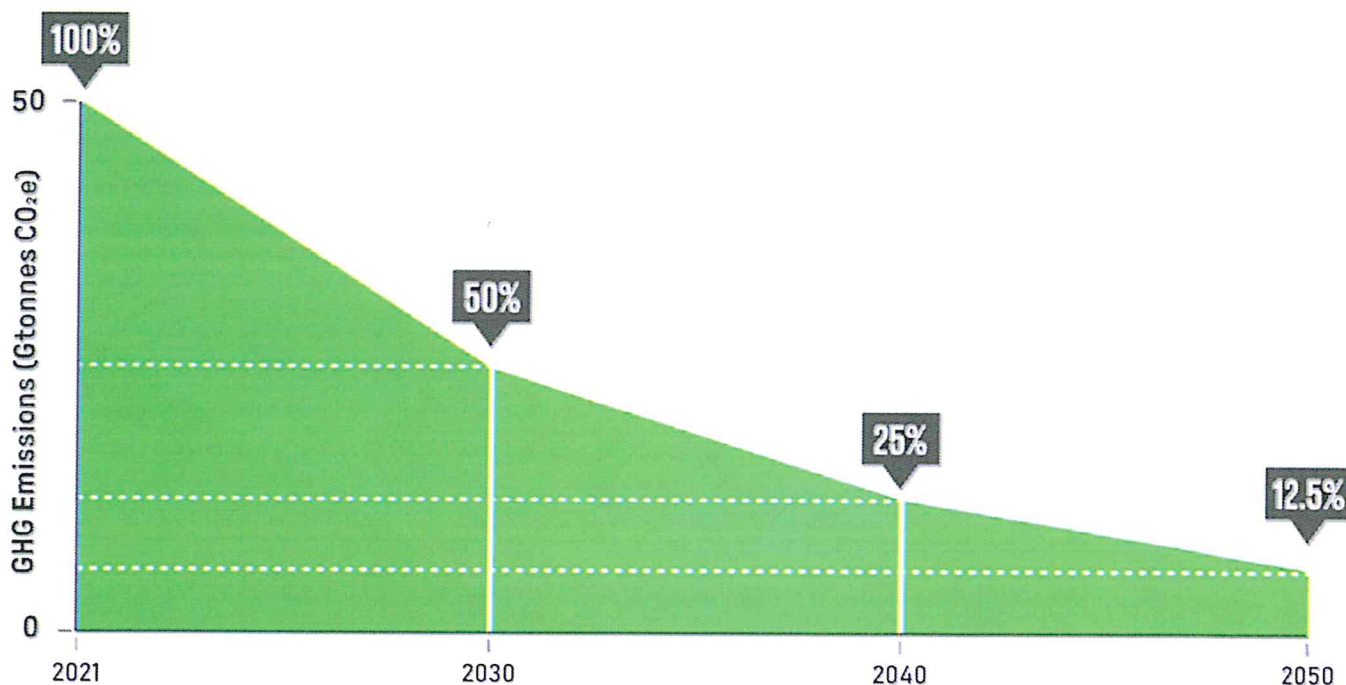


CPI Carbon Reduction Plan

Computer Packages Inc is committed to supporting other businesses in reducing their carbon emissions. CPI commits to reduce GHG emissions. CPI also commits to reduce emissions across the value chain by 2030. These commitments reinforce CPI's commitment towards mitigating the impacts of climate change.

- a) By setting Phase 1 & Phase 2 emission reduction targets consistent with the ambition required to limit warming to 1.5°C.
- b) By setting Phase 3 & Phase 4 a goal to reach net-zero emissions by 2050.



4 Phases:

1st Phase:

- Car Pooling when Traveling
- Credits for Public Transportation
- LEEDS Compliant Buildings
- LED Light Bulbs
- Appliances used at offices are Energy Star Compliant and European Energy Star Compliant
- ISO Compliant
- Daily Recycling at each Location (Paper, Plastic, Metal and Wood)
- Water filtering to eliminate use of plastic bottles at offices
- CPI has set target/goals that we are currently 90% paperless and our long-term plan is to be 100%.

2nd Phase:

- Cloud Hosting Site Using partial renewable energy
- CPI Offices Using partial renewable energy
- Shipping Partners Using Hybrid and Electric Vehicles

3rd Phase:

Our technology maximizes hardware to produce even faster results than previous versions. Our automation of processes eliminate need for paper reporting. CPI software evolution will allow us to meet or exceed our 1.5°C ambition.

Computer Packages has an ESG rating of 67.83 which is in the top 10% compared with other organizations.

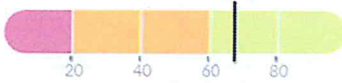
ESG Total
